Grandma Ferrell's Buttermilk Biscuits



These biscuits are pretty close to my Grandma Ferrell's recipe (she wrote very few recipes down). When we would go visit her on her West Virginia farm she

always made plenty of these every morning for breakfast along with sausage gravy, fried apples and plenty of farm fresh eggs. However, my favorite way to eat these is smothered with sweetened Michigan strawberries and fresh whipped cream!

Sift together:

2 C. flour

1/2 tsp. salt

з tsp. baking powder

1/2 tsp. baking soda

Cut in:

1 Tosp. of Crisco shortening

2 Tbsp. cold butter

Add:

3/4 C. of buttermilk

After sifting dry ingredients and cutting shortening/butter in flour mixture with pastry blender, add buttermilk to flour mixture, tossing lightly to keep biscuit light and airy. Knead dough 6 times on floured board. Roll to 3/4 inch thickness. Cut out with large biscuit cutter. Place on greased pan so biscuits barely touch. Brush with melted butter. Bake for 12 minutes at 450 degrees. Feel free to double the recipe for plenty of biscuits!
