### Yummy Snickerdoodles



1 1/2 Cups of flour 1 tsp. of ground cinnamon 1/2 tsp. baking soda 1/4 Cup of shortening 1/4 Cup butter-softened

1/3 Cup sugar

1/3 Cup brown sugar

1 beaten egg

1/2 tsp. vanílla

2 Tbsp. sugar 1/2 tsp. cínnamon

Míx flour, baking soda, cinnamon in separate bowl. Combine sugars, butter, shortening till combined. Add egg & vanilla. Stir in flour mixture until mixed.

Grease cookie sheets. Stir together the 2 Tbsp. sugar and cinnamon. Shape into desired size and roll each ball into cinnamon. Place on cookie sheets 2 inches apart. Bake in a 375 oven for 6 to 8 minutes or until edges are golden brown.
